#### Comments:

A total of 357,000 tonnes of cane was crushed last week, taking the region past the seven million tonnes crushed mark. There are now less than a million tonnes left to crush.

Last week's isolated showers caused some minor interruptions to cane supply. Wet ground conditions continued to impact dirt levels in cane, which caused some delays in processing. However, overall, conditions have improved, with CCS levels rising 0.16 units and dirt levels dropping 0.9 units from the previous week.

Invicta's B side and Kalamia both completed scheduled cleans last week. Invicta's A side, Pioneer and Inkerman will stop for scheduled cleans this week.

The crop forecast has been revised upwards to 8.13 million tonnes. With no further rain, the first mill should finish crushing in late November and the last mill in the first week of December.
