campaigning to reduce ocean waste are among the finalists in the 2018 Reef Champion Awards.

The Awards, run by the Reef Alliance with support from the Australian and Queensland governments, recognise the outstanding achievements of individuals and organisations working to improve the quality of water entering the iconic Great Barrier Reef.

Queensland Farmers' Federation (QFF) CEO Travis Tobin said the finalists reflected the calibre of the work being done by farmers and others working with the agricultural sector to safeguard the future of the Reef.
