Great Barrier Reef Foundation

In April 2019 Project Catalyst was successful in securing funding for two years through the Great Barrier Reef Foundation. This funding takes over from the previous Federal Government Reef Trust 3 program and is to provide support for:

- New Innovation Trials commencing in 2019
 - In May 2019 an Expression of Interest was distributed to growers, Agronomists, Extension Officers, Industry Groups and Productivity

Boards seeking to find the next wave of innovation trials that Project Catalyst could support.

- 26 applications were received and these have now been reviewed by a panel of industry peers to select 10 that will commence in 2019. Once the agreements have been finalised with the On-Ground Service Providers and the growers, the successful trials will be listed on the Project Catalyst Website.
- Continuation of selected existing trials
 - A number of trials that were already underway were reviewed and chosen to continue for the next two years. The extra data collected for these trials will greatly assist in



validating the results collected so far and potentially lead to improved practices being available to the broader grower community.

- Broader Adoption Validation work
 - Project Catalyst has helped many growers to introduce improved farming practices into their farming systems over its 11 years of operation. This part of the Project is designed to expand that group by introducing new growers to some of the previously trialed and proven methods. By providing support through the Agronomists currently working with Project Catalyst we hope to increase the uptake of new and improved practices.

Project Catalyst Grower Forum 2020



The Project Catalyst Annual Forum provides an opportunity for all sugarcane growers, industry bodies and suppliers to meet, network, share ideas and hear from guest speakers on a range of topics to do with the industry, Water Quality and the Great Barrier Reef.

Forum 2020 is keenly anticipated on Daydream Island, off the Whitsunday Coast of Queensland from the 23rd to the 25th of February.
