Annual General Meeting

QSL's 2019 Annual General Meeting was held in Brisbane on Tuesday. Key highlights for the 2018/2019 financial year included:

• QSL remained the largest marketer of Queensland sugar and the largest Australian sugar supplier to South Korea

- QSL-managed ICE 11 pools outperformed our performance benchmark by \$15.16 per tonne IPS
- The QSL pricing team filled 3753 grower pricing orders
- Marketing Choice was extended to Mackay growers, enabling them to access QSL's full range of products for the first time
- We launched an industry-first app
- The QSL Operations team received 3.94 million tonnes through 6 bulk sugar terminals, and dispatched 100% of all shipments on time, in full and within specification
- We successfully renewed our finance facilities

2020 QSL Early-Start Actively Managed Pool: Nominations for this
pool close <u>this Thursday 31 October 2019</u>. This QSL-managed
pricing option targets the best return for participants by pricing in an
active manner designed to exploit short-term market opportunities. As
its name suggests, it starts pricing earlier than the standard QSL

Actively Managed Pool, giving QSL's pool managers an additional six months in which to price this pool's tonnage.

 2020 QSL Self-Managed Harvest: Nominations for this pool close this Thursday 31 October 2019. This grower-managed pricing option is designed to give growers the opportunity to manage their own production risk. To participate, growers must have a minimum of 300 tonnes and 35% of their GEI Sugar with QSL allocated to the QSL Harvest Pool. They are then responsible for pricing the entirety of their QSL Harvest Pool allocation against each of the four futures contracts available each season (July, October, March and May). Pricing restrictions remain in place for 20% of each participating grower's nominated tonnage in the Self-Managed Harvest in order to maintain their production buffer.

QSL Market Update


The sugar market has lost steam over the past three weeks. The ICE 11 hit its high for last week on the Tuesday, reaching 12.59 c/lb before falling to new lows last Friday at 12.20 c/lb. It closed the week at 12.32 c/lb. The Aussie Dollar picked up value, making the most of improved global risk sentiment fired by US and China trade talks, Brexit news and negative US data.
