- Overall Burdekin region cutting slightly under estimate.
- Invicta – availability, tonnes crushed +23,879 are well above budget with crush rate down on budget by 24.1TPH. Mill is ahead of throughput and still have capacity at the pan stage. Trial being considered for new flared bins.
- Pioneer – availability, tonnes crushed -100,952 are behind budget with crush rate slightly above budget by 1.5TPH.
- Kalamia – availability on budget, tonnes crushed -68887 down on budget with crush rate marginally above budget by .7TPH.
- Inkerman – availability and crush rate not available, tonnes -71098 under budget.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1. Haulout Vehicles – it has been highlighted that at times vehicles travelling on main highway during darkness that visibility of taillights to following traffic can be difficult to see due to build-up of dirt/grime etc.
2. In Field Sidings – Recent incident at siding in the Invicta area whereby loco became bogged due to the build-up of billets etc. In terms of CSA Schedule 6, clause 9, it is the growers responsibility to ensure their delivery point/s are cleaned from time to time and maintained in a clean and serviceable state.
3. Growers assistance is sought in ensuring that contractors when undertaking burns are currently only burning sufficient cane for up to two consecutive harvest days in terms of CSA. Reminder that as from 1st October onwards, burns are to be restricted to only one and a half harvest days. There have been incidents in the Invicta area of burns to cover for up to 5 days of harvesting which has been causing Dextran issues in milling operations.
