Comments:

The Burdekin mills processed just under 355,000 tonnes this week.

This was above budget despite a difficult start to the week at Pioneer Mill due to the large volume of low-purity cane. There were also unplanned stops at Pioneer and Inkerman mills at the end of the week.

The Burdekin region has now crushed 7.2 million tonnes of cane, which is 90 per cent of the total estimated crop.

Ground conditions have improved but cane quality is declining as we get closer to the end of the season. Growers have been asked to limit burning to what they can harvest the next day to ensure good quality cane is supplied to the mill.

Average weekly CCS increased to 15 units, which is above budget.

The highest CCS sample was 18.35 from a rake of Q208 fifth ratoon cane in the Invicta area.

Invicta Mill is currently expected to finish the season this Sunday, 15 November. Kalamia Mill is expected to finish the season on Wednesday, 18 November.
