2. Wilmar Burdekin Grower Update - Posted - 9/6/21



Wednesday, 9 June 2021

The 2021 Burdekin crush is under way.

Invicta Mill started crushing early yesterday morning (Tuesday 8 June), and our other three Burdekin mills commenced throughout the day.

We've had some live commissioning issues related to start-up, but we expect the factories to settle in over the coming days.

- Invicta Mill started crushing on B side at 6.04am and A side kicked off about 10am yesterday. Pans and fugals came online around midday today.
- Pioneer Mill started crushing just before midday yesterday. The factory performed well overnight and was the first in the group to produce sugar, at 5am today.
- Kalamia Mill had some issues with live commissioning of the new milling train control system under factory load conditions. We have resolved these issues and restarted operations about 9.30am today.
- Inkerman Mill had some feeding station control issues related to commissioning new equipment under live conditions. There was also a boiler stop due to wet bagasse. Crushing resumed about 1pm today.
