## Australian CliMate app: helps identify potential climate risks

You can use the CliMate app to explore recent and past climate records for your location and get answers about rainfall, temperature and radiation; and derived variables such as heat sums, stored soil water and soil nitrate accumulation in fallows; as well as El Nino – Southern Oscillation status.

**Future Drought Fund releases new platform prototype** 

The Commonwealth Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment has advised that a new platform is now available for testing.

The Drought Resilience Self-Assessment Tool will provide accessible information and an online drought resilience assessment capability for primary producers.


The platform is in the prototype stage and is being tested in four pilot regions across Australia, including the Queensland Dry Tropics. Growers and advisers there can get involved in the testing and provide feedback.

If you are outside the dry tropics, you can still be involved in providing feedback, but the level of potential involvement is reduced.
