



With school holidays under way, we ask parents and carers to remind children about the dangers of being in the vicinity of the cane rail network following a very close call on the weekend.


Please explain to children that cane trains can't swerve and they can't come to a quick stop. It can take up to 1km for a fully-laden cane train to come to a complete stop.


