



2. SRA – Media Release – Fall Armyworm Burdekin detection – Posted – 23/10/21



Fall armyworm (FAW) has been detected on two separate blocks of sugarcane in the Burdekin region. Growers are advised to remain aware and observant, but at this stage there is no cause for action.

The first block where the FAW was detected is young late plant cane and had a high level of grass weeds present in the block. These grass weeds have been controlled, and it is suspected that the population of FAW has subsequently moved from them to the sugarcane crop.

On this block there is less than one FAW per stool, and damage is minimal, so there is no requirement to spray or control the FAW worm at this stage. It is worth noting that there were crops of corn and sorghum in the near vicinity of this affected block and those crops are more susceptible to FAW damage than cane.

Growers are encouraged to remain observant and contact your local advisor if you have any concerns.


The situation is being monitored locally and SRA entomologists will be conducting further analysis on samples. Further updates and advice will be provided.

Previous detections of FAW in sugarcane on the Atherton Tablelands resulted in minimal damage to the crop at the time, and no control operations were required.




