Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) was recently confirmed in 14 piggeries across QLD, NSW and VIC. Biosecurity QLD is working with the operators of the QLD piggery after confirming that diagnosis. JEV is a category 1 restricted matter. Under QLD legislation, if the presence of this disease is suspected in any species of animal, it must be reported to Biosecurity QLD on 13 25 23 or contact the Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888.


