

Meringa entomology team heads up the hill

SRA's Meringa based entomology team travelled to Mareeba recently to attend FNQ Growers Research & Development Field Day.

PhD student Hang Xu presented a poster and spoke with growers about his work on Yellow Canopy Syndrome (YCS).

"My research is following the hypothesis that invertebrates may play a part in YCS," Hang said. "The event was a good opportunity for me to talk directly with industry participants and receive feedback from them about my work at the same time as meeting with other researchers in the agriculture industry."

Hang's PhD is under the supervision of UniSQ and SRA and is supported by Grains R&D Corporation, through funding from the Australian Government Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry as part of its Rural R&D for Profit program and Cotton R&D Corporation, Horticulture Innovation Australia, Wine Australia, Sugar Research Australia and Forest & Wood Products Australia.



NQ Dry Tropics Burdekin Sugarcane Science Forum

The annual Burdekin Sugarcane Science Forum, hosted by NQ Dry Tropics, was held on 21st June. The day started at the Burdekin PCYC, with great talks from a variety of speakers on various topics such as soil health, treatment wetlands, and tools for improved farm management.

After lunch, attendees visited a demonstration site at the SISL farm on Callaghan Road, where engaging practical demonstrations were delivered. Of particular focus for the afternoon was the new Burdekin Irrigation Project (BIP).

The BIP is led by Sugar Research Australia (SRA) and delivered by a consortium of cross-disciplinary stakeholders. The project aims to transition growers to scalable, sustainable, and technologically assisted practices in irrigation management, using a whole-of-systems approach that includes water quality validation by BBIFMAC.

Terry Granshaw, District Manager at SRA presented a live interview with Ryan Matthews, SISL Farm Manager, about his motivation for getting involved in the BIP project, and the benefits he has already observed with converting to a fully automated irrigation practice to improve efficiency.

Arwen Rickert, Manager of BBIFMAC, presented on the water quality outcomes of the monitoring conducted at the SISL farm. The most profound being a reduction from 25% of irrigation applied being lost to runoff, to just 8% over the course of four irrigations (Subsequent to the presentation, further reductions in runoff volumes were observed as low as 5% at this farm).

Mackenzie Severns, Project Officer at BBIFMAC, also had the opportunity to present on the Fine Scale Water Quality Monitoring Project, led by the Queensland Government's Water Quality Investigations team (WQI) and delivered in partnership with BBIFMAC.

Two new sites in the Burdekin region have recently been installed at the Burdekin River near Dalbeg Pump Station, and at Lilliesmere Lagoon. Additionally, four of the Burdekin Bluespot sites in the Barratta Creek system (part of a project that was completed in 2021), are being converted to real-time monitoring sites as part of the fine scale project.

The real-time data collected from the sites is being uploaded to the CSIRO 1622™ portal and is available for public viewing at https://wg.1622.farm/

BBIFMAC encourage stakeholders and growers to take a look at the information available via 1622, and note down any queries or improvements you would like to see, to be raised with the DES WQI team at an upcoming BBIFMAC meeting later this year.

Applied Hydrology Field Trip

North Qld Wetlands Stakeholders were very fortunate to participate in an Applied Hydrology fieldtrip in Ingham on 27th July. Attendees visited two wetland restoration sites at Mungalla Station (near Ingham) and discussed the opportunities and challenges of working in the field.

Associate Professor William Glamore, and Dr. Valentin (Tino) Heimhuber from the Water Research Laboratory at the University of NSW travelled up to deliver the tailored training to Natural Resource Management Groups and Extension Officers in the North.

This workshop was organised by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries and UNSW, with assistance from Greening Australia, and funded by the Queensland Reef Water Quality Program.

4. 2022 Season Amended Crop Estimates & Finish Dates – Posted – 8/8/22

2022 Season Amended Crop Estimates and Finish Dates

At the recent Harvest Management Group meeting on Wednesday, 27 July 2022, Wilmar advised that the estimate for the Burdekin had increased from 7,940,000t to 8,150,00t.

This has been apportioned across the factories in the table below and we also included budgeted finish dates which have been recently revised.

These finish dates are budgeted estimates only and include an allowance for a further 2 weeks of wet weather. These dates are subject to change with any further cane transfer arrangements, mill performance and wet weather. The budgeted dates for Invicta and Pioneer already include cane transfer out of Pioneer which has recently commenced. Prior to this transfer decision, Pioneer were looking at a 29/12/22 finish date.







Another good crushing week in the Burdekin saw just over 380,000 tonnes crushed. This brings the season-to-date total to just under 1.8M tonnes.

The average weekly CCS was 13.51, which is still below budget, however continued dry weather is seeing a progression back towards budget.

The highest CCS sample was 17.2 from a rake of Q183-P in the Mulgrave productivity zone.

While the first quarter of the 2022 season has been largely incident free, locals and visitors are reminded to take care around our cane rail network.

Please approach all level crossings with caution and always give way to cane trains.
