

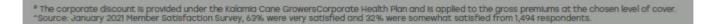

PBR days in Mackay

In National Science Week this week SRA pays tribute to all our scientists and researchers, including our variety development staff.

A team of SRA staff work together every year to describe the new sugarcane varieties that have come through the SRA Breeding Program. The information is used to apply for Plant Breeder's Rights (PBR) protection for the new varieties.

"This year's PBR activities were held in Mackay in July, and five new varieties were described in combination with 11 other comparator varieties growing in the same PBR trial," said Tissue Culture Leader, Variety Development, Clair Bolton.

Southern Weed Management Workshops create interest

With growers starting to think about pre-emergent weed control, SRA Weed Scientist, Emilie Fillols' recent Southern Weed Management workshops were well attended. Growers gave the workshops a score of 9/10 on whether they felt they had learnt valuable information from the workshop. "Hold more workshops," was one comment.

The three-hour workshops looked at a variety of weed species and the factors which influence their control, including the life cycle and habits of the particular weed, the type of herbicide used, the timing of application, the soil type, the presence of a trash blanket, the farming system and the method of incorporation e.g. mechanical or rain.

"Unlike knockdown herbicides that display visual effects on weed foliage, the action of pre-emergent herbicides is underground, so you can't see what's happening (or not happening). Knowing the factors that impact on pre-emergence herbicides' efficacy helps the grower achieve greater success every time," said Emilie.

SIPP visit for SRA Woodford

Fifteen Grade 10 students and two teachers from Caloundra State High School visited SRA Woodford Pathology Research Station this week.

Students were shown the laboratory to see nematode and smut research. They were intrigued to see live smut and nematodes under the microscope. They were also taken out to see sugar cane growing in the field and the diseases that can afflict the crop.

The tour was hosted by Biosecurity and Disease Screening Manager, Shamsul Buiyan and Field Operations Leader Andrew Greet (*above with students in the cane field*), as part of the School to Industry Partnership Program (SIPP) in the Sunshine Coast area aimed at increasing students' and educators' awareness of the variety of careers in agriculture.



Mackay students get EXCITED!

"You'll find an exciting job in agriculture that suits your interests." That's what organisers of the EXCITED 4 Careers in Agriculture national project want children from kindergarten to Grade 10 to know.

A roadshow for the project started in the Mackay district on 9 August with a visit to Homebush State School. SRA District Manager Central Dylan Wedel *(above)* gave a presentation to primary school students showing the jobs involved in making sugar. A teacher-industry networking evening at SRA Mackay followed and visits to a number of other schools in the region.

"The days gave students an insight into what careers are available in the sugar industry and hopefully they will consider this in the years ahead," said Dylan.

Funded by the Australian Government's National Careers Institute, EXCITED for Agriculture is a joint initiative between CQUniversity Australia and a range of industry partners, including Sugar Research Australia.

New evaporators take shape

While the focus at this time of year tends to be on the crush, Wilmar Sugar's work execution teams are working behind the scenes on major pieces of plant that will be installed once the season ends.

Crews at Wilmar's Burdekin Centralised Workshop are currently fabricating two new evaporators for Kalamia Mill.

Costed at around \$6 million each, the two vessels are among four replacement evaporators being installed at Kalamia over a three-year period.

The first evaporator was fabricated last year and installed ahead of this year's crush, the two vessels currently under construction will be installed ahead of the 2023 crush, and the fourth new vessel will be installed ahead of the 2024 season.

The total program of works is worth \$25 million and is being carried out in-house.

Work Execution Manager Glenn Brock said the major components were being fabricated at Pioneer Mill, while sections of pipe and other structures were being manufactured at Wilmar's Kalamia, Inkerman and Plane Creek Mill workshops.

"The new evaporators will replace older vessels that have reached end of life. We're also taking this opportunity to standardise the vessels in the evaporator station in terms of design, construction and capacity," he said.

"Each of the new evaporators will have a seven metre diameter and a heating surface area of 3250sqm."

The new evaporators are part of a much larger program to replace end-of-life vessels across all of Wilmar's eight sugar mills.







Comments:

Another good crushing week in the Burdekin saw just under 405,000 tonnes crushed – the highest weekly throughput for the region, season to date.

It brings the season total to just over 2.5M tonnes, or approximately 30 per cent of the forecast crop.

The average weekly CCS was 14.17, which is still below the original budget, but is getting closer due to the continued dry conditions.

The highest CCS sample was 17.4 from a rake of Q240-1R in the Stockham Road productivity zone.

We are one-third of the way through the season and the number of incidents and recorded near misses at level crossings remains very low.

Please continue to approach all cane rail crossings with caution and always give way to cane trains.


