


# Dale LAST MP Member for Burdekin Regular eNewsletter Working for you

**Parliamentary Update** 

I'd like to start by sending my condolences to the Royal Family and paying my respect to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, in recognition of her extraordinary contribution and life.

Parliamentary Sittings will officially resume on October 11 and I am looking forward to again being your voice on the floor of Parliament and prosecuting those issues that matter to us in the North of the State.

Over the past couple of weeks I have spent time travelling around the electorate visiting our schools and hospitals who do a fantastic job educating our children and providing essential health care.

### Action on road safety starts with safe roads

During the earlier September sitting of Parliament, Transport Legislation amendments were debated and as the Shadow Minister for Rural and Regional Queensland and the Shadow Minister for Police I spoke about the impact of substandard roads and a sobering statistic that would send shivers up the spine of every Queenslander.

Already this year 75 per cent of road fatalities have occurred in rural and regional Queensland. While driver behaviour plays a significant role, it is up to the state government to ensure the roads that we drive on are actually safe.

Currently around Bowen is a 30km section of road works on the Bruce Highway that has sat dormant for seven months because this state government failed to do its due diligence with contractors. Seven months of inaction on a 30-kilometre section of the Bruce Highway is not good enough and I have ramped up the pressure on the Government to secure a Contractor to complete this project.

If we are going to get serious about addressing the road toll in Queensland, our roads need to be up to scratch, and unfortunately at the present time in many parts of Queensland that is not the case.



#### A year of promises in health

September marked a year since the National Rural Health Commissioner Ruth Stewart conducted a 1000km road tour of the Burdekin electorate, hearing directly from our community about issues we face accessing primary medical assistance.

Prof Stewart, toured Bowen, Collinsville, Moranbah, Clermont and Dysart, hearing from stakeholders as well as those working on the front line.

While we still have a long bringing about adequate access to health professionals in places like Dysart and Clermont or returning maternity services to Bowen it's important to recognise the level of community advocacy that has gone on over several years, at all levels of government and from the community.



#### Basics need to be ticked to ensure resilience

Living in the North brings with it some of the best opportunities to get outdoors and explore, but when it comes to our storm and cyclone season it's important that we are prepared. The state government has released its new Queensland Strategy for Disaster Resilience,. This is a document that aims to focus on ensuring we, as North Queenslanders are resilient and ready for times of disaster, but it also highlights the need for getting the basics

After all, in order to be resilient and ensure our communities can withstand a natural disaster, we need to have the road networks that won't wash away during a flooding event, we need the ability to ensure we can access medical help not just immediately after a natural disaster and more importantly, we need to know that the services provided by all levels of government are available without question or hesitation and with what ever resources are needed in every

I have recently written to the Attorney General regarding the funding and calling for a longterm funding agreement immediately.

This state government pockets billions of dollars in royalties from the Isaac region each year and to leave some of the most vulnerable in that community with nothing but uncertainty is something that every Queenslander would find completely reprehensible.


#### Bowen centre of the universe for space travel
