SIX EASY STEPS® goes online

SRA has launched a new online training course based on the SIX EASY STEPS* face-to-face workshops free to cane growers and their advisors.

The Online Sugarcane Nutrient Management training course was developed for sugarcane growers who want to refresh or up-skill their knowledge of nutrient management for sustainable sugarcane production.

In response to requests from the industry, the training will also provide growers with the necessary knowledge to create an annual nitrogen and phosphorus (N&P) budget for their farms.

A grower who successfully completes this training program will be considered an Appropriate Person under the definition of the Queensland Government's Reef protection regulations.

The course is now available online for all sugarcane growers and advisors on the SRA website.

Recommendations from EEF60 project now in the toolbox

Results and recommendations from the 'Support of cane farmer trials of enhanced efficiency fertiliser (EEF) in the catchments of the Great Barrier Reef (EEF60)' project; and then its extension 'Cane farmer trials and modelling of EEFs' have now been added to the SIX EASY STEPS TOOLBOX

Funded by the partnership between the Australian Government's Reef Trust and the Great Barrier Reef Foundation EEFs were tested over four seasons on 74 sugarcane farms located between Mossman and Bundaberg. The results show that when high nitrogen loss conditions are likely, EEFs are a good option.

The on-ground testing and modelling was possible with support from a collaborative partnership between Sugar Research Australia, Department of Agriculture and Fisheries, CSIRO, CANEGROWERS, productivity services and cane farmers.

Improved spraying practices will not only benefit your pocket

The fallout from poor spraying practices can go far beyond the economic damage on your own farm, as NSW cotton growers recovering from a widespread drift event over Christmas will tell you. To have your livelihood significantly (and repeatedly) affected by the actions of someone else can be devastating economically and emotionally.

Drift management is one of the many topics covered in our Advanced Knockdown Herbicides workshops held in partnership with Nufarm and Croplands in Mackay, Rocky Point and Bundaberg. (More workshops are planned for other regions.) It is a 'must do' for growers who want to optimise their herbicide spraying practices.

"The workshops will improve growers' weed management knowledge so they don't need to rely on others; help growers understand on their own farms what went wrong when they experienced poor weed control and toxicity on cane; and point out the risks of getting it wrong: to other crops, their own crop, their own safety, and the environment," Emilie said.

The workshops will include live demonstrations from Nufarm and Croplands to illustrate product incompatibility and the effect of nozzles and adjuvants on drift.

Farming in the Reef



Farm drains have the potential to work like wetlands and remove nitrates from waterways

That was the focus of a recent workshop at Murray Upper near Tully where farmers and extension officers looked at how to modify and manage drains for the win-win outcome of improving water quality while maintaining production.

Farmers and extension officers at the workshop visited a functioning vegetated drain (pictured above) and saw another where there are plans to reinforce some banks and revegetate the edges. These kind of changes can improve the capacity of some drains to reduce sediment and nutrients while maintaining flows. And with all the drains in our region the potential is exciting!

This workshop was a joint initiative of Terrain NRM and the Queensland Government's Department of Agriculture and Fisheries. It was part of the Mobilising the Mossman and

Murray project, funded by the Australian Government's Reef Trust and delivered by Terrain NRM in partnership, in the Murray region, with SRA.

Learning how new varieties are screened for disease resistance

A group of sugarcane growers from Rocky Point last week visited SRA Woodford on a tour organised by SRA District Manager - Southern, Lisa Devereaux and CANEGROWERS Rocky Point, as part of activities in the Southern district plan.

The growers were addressed by SRA Manager, Biosecurity and Disease Screening, Shamsul Bhuiyan and other staff who demonstrated the complex process involved in developing cane varieties that are disease resistant.
