Farming insights in Reef catchments

In the past two years, the Queensland Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF) has embarked on a comprehensive market research initiative focusing on producers' attitudes towards the adoption of farming best practices in the catchments of the Great Barrier Reef.

In the next phase, a phone survey of producers and residents within Reef catchments will begin soon.

DAF says the aim is to ensure Queensland Reef Water Quality Program projects continue to foster improvements in economic, social and environmental outcomes for the future by understanding producers' attitudes towards farming practices and the challenges faced by the agricultural sector.


