GeoSelect: Eliminating Guesswork from Selective Spraying

HARDI Australia has been a pioneer in technological advancements for Australian farmers, introducing a groundbreaking solution to the enduring agricultural challenge of weed control. GeoSelect is a new system which enables centimetre perfect herbicide application and can reduce costs by as much as 90 percent.

Geoselect is a decoupled system using remotely-sensed data from drones or fixed-wing aircraft for precise weed identification down to the centimeter, unlike traditional sprayers with attached cameras on a boom.

The HARDI patented "perpixel" processing algorithm can then tell farmers precisely how much chemical they will need before they start spraying.

Geoselect features higher resolution cameras for enhanced precision compared to current prescription map versions.

Integration of four GPS receivers on the boom ensures spraying accuracy equivalent to drone-captured data.

Geoselect operates at a plant-based precision level rather than an area-based level, marking a significant capability advancement. Gateway-enabled machines allow HARDI technicians to remotely access and observe farmers' operations in real-time, providing technical assistance.

HARDI recently concluded trials for its ongoing green-on-green initiative. Discussions are underway with a company in Adelaide that conducted aerial surveys of some paddocks using a hyperspectral camera, presenting a novel approach for HARDI.

"The results are pending, but we're genuinely enthusiastic about the potential outcomes. This endeavor promises to add a new dimension to our green-on-green season," remarked Heath Thompson, HARDI's Innovation Manager.
