The showcase was an opportunity to share SRA's draft Research & Development Plan (2024-2034) with the industry and through discussion and engagement throughout the day to seek feedback from stakeholders.

SRA will now incorporate feedback received during the forum into the plan to ensure it will deliver maximum benefits to the industry. The final plan will be available by the end of June.

"I appreciated the positive feedback in the meeting, to me personally, and via the media," Shaun said. "I am grateful that industry believes our draft strategic research plan is on the right road and that our staff are considered to be doing a good job in helping to improve the industry's profitability and sustainability, and ultimately its competitiveness in the world market."


Decision time for new clones

SRA's Variety Development team met in Bundaberg this week for the Annual Selection Meeting. The data collected on the latest sugarcane clones over the past harvest season is reviewed at the meeting. This work is done in preparation for the industry's six Regional Variety Committee (RVC) meetings which begin in April.

"Getting together over two days, the team discusses the performance information for advanced new clones to take to the RVCs for progression, discard, or commercial release decisions," said Dr Jason Eglinton, General Manager, Variety Development. "It is an important time for us to critically examine the performance data and what it means for the fate of potential new varieties before consulting with industry." Planting a new variety

is one of the biggest investments a grower will make and this work is to ensure it's a win for the industry as a whole.

The 20-person Policy Council meets regularly to decide the overall strategic direction of CANEGROWERS, while the Board is responsible for corporate governance.



Great turnout for sugarcane disease ID course at Woodford

Participants at the 2024 Sugarcane Disease Identification Course at Woodford came from as far north as Mossman. The hands-on course at SRA's Woodford pathology research station, gave participants the opportunity to see sugarcane diseases in the field and learn identification skills from SRA's pathology team.

Some of the comments from attendees included: "Pleased to hear SRA is taking forward new concepts in diagnostics and testing" and "I found the course useful in learning the soil sampling process for diseases such as Pachymetra and RSD. In my job I will be sampling for RSD for the first time this season".

Your time to shine

Applications for 2025 Nuffield Scholarships are open now and close on 31 May.

Each scholarship is valued at \$40,000. Nuffield Australia will award up to 20 scholarships this year. Scholarships on offer include five drought resilience scholarships, and others for sugar, horticulture, grains, dairy, wool, fisheries, cotton and more. Nuffield Scholarships are open to all those involved in food and fibre production typically aged between 28 and 45.

The bursary allows scholars to travel for 15 weeks over the next two years to study a topic important to their industry. With international travel back in full swing, Nuffield

Australia has groups of scholars travelling to every corner of the globe this year. Shortlisted applicants will be interviewed during June and July. Successful recipients will be announced at the Nuffield Australia National Conference in Launceston from 2-4 September.


