Securing Australia's cane industry: International project underway



Australia's sugarcane industry is playing a key role in strengthening the biosecurity of the region, with promising developments underway through international collaborations.

A project trialling Australian sugarcane varieties in Indonesia is not only a significant opportunity for SRA to expand its global reach, but also a crucial component of the Board's broader strategic plan. The SRA Strategic Plan 2021-2026 outlines key actions aimed at increasing revenue to sustain and enhance its operations. This strategy is being executed through three main avenues:

- 1. Winning externally funded projects
- 2. Provision of consultancy services
- 3. Increasing opportunities for sale of cane varieties overseas.

The Indonesian project contributes significantly to this goal by providing a substantial and growing revenue stream. The projected net revenue from this project – with the potential to reach several million dollars per year – will be reinvested into the Australian sugarcane industry to fund research priorities that directly benefit local growers.

New projects work to overcome productivity constraints

Two new projects are underway in sugarcane growing regions of the Wet Tropics and the Burnett Mary to help growers identify and overcome constraints on their farms which are holding back productivity, profitability and sustainability.

The aim of both projects is to provide one-on-one tailored agronomic extension services to participating growers to improve cane and sugar yields while ensuring optimal inputs and environmental benefits on their farms.

The projects are part of the \$4.38 million Sugarcane Practice Change Program funded through the Queensland Government's <u>Queensland Reef Water Quality Program</u>.

Burdekin growers - you're invited to learn more about weeds




