## Comments:

The Burdekin mills processed just over 367,000 tonnes of cane for the week. This was below budget even though Kalamia Mill recorded its highest weekly throughput for the year.

The region's overall throughput was impacted by scheduled cleaning and maintenance days at the other three Burdekin mills, and an unplanned stop at Invicta to carry out repairs to the steam/water condenser on Boiler 3.

The season-to-date total of 3.65M tonnes represents 44% of the Burdekin's estimated 8.20M tonne crop.

The average weekly CCS was 14.18. This is still below budget after the significant wet weather event in August, but improving slowly.

The highest CCS of 17.5 was from a rake of Q240-2R in the Mulgrave (Invicta) productivity district.
