Comments:

Both Pioneer and Invicta mills recommenced production last week following a wet weather stop. The factories ran consistently, and a total of more than 120,000 tonnes of cane was crushed for the week.

CCS is declining and paddock conditions are challenging, however, we are hopeful that as much of the remaining cane as possible can be harvested and processed while conditions allow.

While rail operations around Kalamia and Inkerman mills are now winding down, cane trains are still operating in full swing at Invicta and Pioneer. For the remainder of the school holidays, parents and carers should continue to remind children of the risks of playing on or near the rail network.
