Products to be used:

ADAMA MCPA 750 HERBICIDE (APVMA No. 53893)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 750 g/L MCPA present as the DIMETHYLAMINE SALT as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Sugar cane	Vine weeds including: Bellvine <i>(Ipomoea plebeia)</i> Pink convolvulus (<i>Convolvulus angustissimus</i>) Red convolvulus <i>(Ipomoea hederifolia)</i> Morning glory <i>(Ipomoea purpurea)</i> Star-of-Bethlehem <i>(Ipomoea quamoclit)</i> Stinking passionflower <i>(Passiflora foetida)</i>	930 mL/ha

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply a single application in late summer or autumn.
- Spraying should be delayed until autumn to minimise damage to cane.
- Apply as an over crop spray via ground based boom spray or aerially using fixed wing or rotary equipment.
- Use a spray volume of 30-120 L/ha for ground based application.
- Use a spray volume of 10-90 L/ha for aerial application.
- DO NOT apply more than 1 application per crop.

Withholding Period:

Harvest: DO NOT harvest for 5 weeks after application.

Grazing: DO NOT graze or cut for stockfeed for 5 weeks after application.

Jurisdiction:

QLD and NSW.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

The holder of the permit must notify the APVMA of new information, including relevant information in accordance with section 161 of the Schedule to the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Act 1994*, in accordance with the obligation imposed by that section.

To Avoid Crop Damage

The sensitivity of the crop to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable to only treat a small area to ascertain the reaction before treating the whole crop.
